

CORP. JOHN L. DAVIS' BODY

**Will Arrive Here From Ponce the Last
of March,**

The body of Corporal John L. Davis will arrive here the latter part of March. So says a recent communication from the War Department at Washington received by J. C. Davis, of Richfield, father of the deceased. Corporal Davis died of typhoid fever at Ponce, Porto Rico, Aug. 9, 1898, and his body has since rested in the city cemetery at that place. Last spring the work of transferring the remains of soldiers who died in Porto Rico to the United States was discontinued on account of the approach of warm weather and only recently taken up again.

The funeral arrangements have been placed in the hands of his old comrades of volunteer Co. A and the ceremonies which will attend the final interment of the body in Richfield cemetery will be impressive and befitting a United States soldier who gave up his life in the service of his country.

The forthcoming funeral of the late Corporal Davis will form the closing chapter of our volunteer company's fatalities during the campaign. The bodies of Corporal Herman Bartels and Private Alfred Bargeron were buried here, Private Leopold Daul in Rozellville, Private Theo. Bronson at Stevens Point, Private John Van-Breda in Michigan, Private Jacob Kronsoble, Fortress Monroe.
