Sgt. Howard W. "Bud" Pagels, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. William C. Pagels, Route 2. Wisconsin Rapids, was killed in action May 9 on Lucon island in the Philippines, according to a war department telegram received by the soldier's parents. ents.

He was born in Wisconsin Raplids June 12, 1921, attended Hillview rural school and was graduated from Lincoln High school with the class of 1939. Prior to his entry mot the army in August, 1912, he was employed by the Biron division of Consolidated Water Power and Paper company.

The sergeant received military training at Fort Sheridan, Ill., Comp Caribelle, Fla., Fort George Meade, Md., and Camp Livingston, La., and went overseas to the Hawiian Islands in December, 1918. Later, he served in New Guinea and then in the Philippnes. Ilis last letter to his parents was datelined April 22 of this year.

Sergeant Pagels is survived by his parents, two brothers, Kenneth and Dale, and three susters, Barbara, Arliene and Mrs. Earl Johnson, all residing at the Route 2 address. ill be
