## Wounds Fatal To Sgt. Pinney

Pittsville—Sgt. Clifford Pinney, Route 1, Pittsville, died April 12 of wounds received in action off the island of Luzon, according to a war department telegram received Tues- day night by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Roy Pinney of Pittsville.

Sergeant Pinney entered the army December 23, 1942, training at Fort Lewis, Wash., and a desert training center near Los Angeles. He was sent to Hawaii with the in- fantry in July, 1943.

Surviving in addition to his par- ents are four sisters, Mrs. Aileen Zieher, Port Edwards; Mrs. Irene Zieher, Vesper; Mrs. Lucille Bolster, Marshfield; Mrs. James Upton, Pittsville, and two brothers, Robert, with the navy in the Pacific, and Floyd, with the army in Europe.
