The parish hall was the scene of a 1 o'clock banquet served by women of the congregation, followed by an inspiring program, and the jubi-lee festivities were climaxed in the evening when the church was filled to overflowing as Bishop Treacy administered the sacrament of confirmation to approximately 100 children and adults.

The Very Rev. Msgr. C. W. Gille was master of coremonies at the jubilee program following the midday banquet, Entertainment included music by a string trio composed of Mrs. Dorothy Coe Lipke, harpist; Carl Groulef, violinist, and Mrs. James Hardtke, violist; a song by the St. Lawrence choir; a drill by children of the primary grades of the parish school, and a festival dance by third and fourth grade girls.

The jubilee queen, Shirley Kubisiak, whose grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Casper Kubisiak, are charter members of the parish, welcomed Bishop Treacy on behalf of the congregation and presented to him a beautiful bouquet of red roses.

Treacy commended members of St. Lawrence on what has been accomplished during the parish's first 50 years, both spiritually and in the physical achievements represented by its splendid church edifice, the parish school, and the new rectory which is now under construction.

Report Local Pilot Aboard Crashed Plane

First Lt. James C. Prebbanow, Bon of Mr. and Mrs. Irvin Prebbanow, 151 Sixteenth avenue north, was aboard a U.S. air force plane which crashed in Japan September 24, his parents were advised in a telegram received Sunday evening.

The telegram, signed by Gen. Hoyt Vandenburg, air force chief of staff, said that Lt. Prebbanow's status was not at that time determined, but promised that further information would be forwarded as soon as available.
Lt. Prebbanow was assigned to

the Forty-First Fighter Interceptor squadron, stationed at Johnson air orce base 40 miles northwest of Tokyo, as a jet plane pilot.

His parents had received a letter from him September 16, telling of his experiences since his arrival in Japan and of the duties which his squadron had been assigned in the ir defense of Honshu island.
