Milladore — (Special) — Pfc. Clarence Rickl, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Rickl, Milladore, has been seriously wounded in the fighting in Korea. The report was received by his parents from the Defense Department.

The 25-year-old soldier was a member of the 38th Regiment of the Second Infantry Division. At the time he was wounded, his division was absorbing the brunt of the unsuccessful Chinese spring offensive.

His parents last heard from him two weeks ago. Rickl attended St. Killian's parochial school at Blenker and entered the Army in September last year. He returned home on furlough in February and then shipped to Korea, landing at Pusan.
