The body of Flight Officer Frank H. Giese, who was killed Tuesday when his light bomber crashed near Meridian, Miss., will arrive in Wisconsin Rapids Sunday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock at the Milwaukee depot. It will be brought from Will Rogers field under military escort.

Legion Conducts Military Rites

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Methodist church, the Rev. A. W. Triggs officiating, and burial will be in Forest Hill cemetery with military rites at the grave in charge of the American Legion.

Flight Officer Giese was one of the charter members of the Wisconsin Rapids squadron of the Sons of the American Legion. Two of the pall bearers will be other charter members of the SAL, and other pall bearers will be Legionnaires. The SAL squadron will march as honorary pall bearers.

To Have Honor Guard

An escort of SAL members and Legionnaires will meet the body at the depot and accompany it to the Baker and Son mortuary to lie until time of services. Honor guards will be on duty at the mortuary.

Besides his mother, a sister, Bette, and a brother Stanley, who is a naval air cadet attending pre-flight school at Monmouth college, the 21-year-old flier is survived by his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry J. Giese.
