that had led Ross to give Wallace a tentative go-ahead to release the letter.

Thus, it broke into print as the week-old cabinet drama moved toward this afternoon's climax act in Mr. Truman's office.

Whether Wallace would choose to keep his position in silence or get out and fight for the foreign policy he believes America should have was his own secret for the moment.

Mr. Truman has sent a message to Byrnes at Paris thanking him for his forbearance and understanding throughout the Wallace controversy.

Byrnes has maintained strict silence.

Wallace's New York speech prompted Adm. William H. Standley, this country's wartime ambassador to Moscow, to declare that the commerce secretary "has sabotaged our ship of state."

"He is not only guilty of disloyalty to his president and nation," the retired naval officer and diplomat said in a speech at Los Angeles last night, "but he has given aid and comfort to a virtual enemy, an offense for which, in time of war, he could be shot."

Arpin-Vesper Legion Post Given Permanent Charter

At a meeting held in the Community hall at Arpin February 7, George Lingford and John Reed of Arpin, both veterans of World War I, assembled ex-servicemen of the Arpin, Vesper and Auburndale communities and assisted by Legionnaires Fred Bushnell and G. S. Hein of Wisconsin Rapids, a new American Legion post was formed.

The permanent charter, issued at the national headquarters in Indianapolis, was awarded to members of the post at a recent meeting held in the Arpin hall. The charter was presented to George Lingford, post commander, by Bushnell, past department vice commander. In his address to the gathering of post members following the award, the 27-year veteran Legionnaire lauded the progress made by the new Legion post during the first seven months of its organization, which now has grown to 60 members.

During the course of the evening, G. S. Hein, Wood county commander, conducted the formal installation of post officers, re-elected by the members. Those who were installed in office were Lingford, commander, Arpin; Anselm Simonis, vice commander, Vesper; Ralph Robinson, second vice commander, Arpin; John Reed, adjutant, Arpin; Alfred Nelson, Sr., finance officer, Arpin; Robert Draxler, service officer, Auburndale; Joseph Cress, historian, Auburndale; Alois Meyer, sergeant at arms, Arpin; Henry Henke, sergeant at arms, Vesper.

Two large, framed plaque-like memorials containing colored photographs of Pvt. Verlyn Ebert of Arpin and Charles Hladiek of Vesper, in whose honor the post was named, together with an appropriate, lettered inscription, was also presented to the post. One of them will be hung in the Arpin hall and one in the Vesper hall. The post is to meet alternately in Arpin and Vesper the second Monday evening of each month.
